Amenities and Facilities on the Campus

Canteen

The college maintains a canteen on a contract basis which is subject to renewal upon the satisfaction of the college management. It provides snacks, breakfast in the morning, lunch in the afternoon, bottled drinks and other refreshment items which are sold at a reasonable rate. Needless to say that the canteen offers good quality food at reasonable charges. There is a spacious hall for the staff and students to relax and enjoy while having their food. Every item sold in the canteen is supervised by a quality control officer of the college on a day-to-day basis. There is a complaint/suggestion box placed at the entrance of the library wherein the students may drop in their complaints/grievances/suggestions related to food or service provided in the canteen.

Stationery Shop

The college runs a stationery shop which sells all sorts of stationery items from sheets of papers to pens, pencils, erasers, markers, notebooks and other such items. It provides the students with photocopying facilities too. The students can take photocopies of their study materials or text books (subject to fair use policy) or documents on payment of a nominal charge. This shop sells wide varieties of food items such as biscuits, cakes, cool drinks, ice-creams, chocolates, toffees, and other such items at a reasonable price.

Prayer Halls

There are two halls exclusively allotted for the purpose of prayers. They are properly maintained to preserve the sanctity and sacredness. They have all the facilities required.

Emergency Services

The college administration takes utmost care in maintaining the campus a safe and secure place. We have a fleet of vehicles at our disposal to face any emergency situation. The college has an understanding with the **KMT (Kayal Medical Trust) Hospital**, which is just a kilometer away, to respond to medical emergencies. The college also has provisions to offer First Aid to the students. There is also a rest room which is easily accessible for students and staff to take rest in the event of any medical/health exigencies.

Discipline

The following disciplinary rules are framed by the management in conformity with the university academic policy in order to administer the college affairs effectively, and the rules are subject to review and change as and when required by the management.

1. Students are expected to be polite, courteous and respectful while interacting with staff members.

2. No student is expected to come late to college and in the event of their being late for whatever reason, they need to seek permission from the principal, and only then they shall be allowed inside the classroom.
3. Students are expected to maintain cordiality with one another and they should not behave in any manner which either directly or indirectly causes friction, misunderstanding, conflicts, chaos, disorder, disruption which disturbs the peaceful environment of the campus.
4. Students are strictly warned against involving in any kind of talk or discussion related to politics or any other matter which may become offensive, defamatory or, which has the potential to become a source of inconvenience and disturbance.
5. No student is permitted to organize meetings or any other programs including collecting funds for any purpose whatsoever without obtaining the due permission from the principal.
6. Every student is requested to exercise due care and diligence while using the facilities provided to them and in case of any damage done, they shall be held accountable.
7. Any damage either partial or total to furniture or any other article belonging to the college shall attract the penalty as determined by the management and in case the damage is caused by a group of students then a common fine shall be imposed upon them.

8. Students are advised not to discontinue the studies on flimsy grounds.
9. Attendance is compulsory for the classes, assembly sessions, meetings, and any other programs which college may organize as part of academic requirements.
10. Students are expected to attend the Independence Day, and the Republic day functions.
11. Students while they are on the campus are prohibited from using mobile phones or any other electronic gadgets which in the considered opinion of the management shall cause needless inconvenience, discomfort, distraction or disturbance to the students.
12. Students are asked strictly not to indulge in ragging in any form including the use of abusive words against the juniors , showing of gestures of threat and intimidation, causing fear by means of actions, words: verbal or otherwise, any other such means which could cause anxiety and worry. The college management shall take appropriate action against offenders.

Attendance Policy and Leave Rules

1. The implementation of Attendance and Assessment Record note book system is in effect from 2018 - 2019.
2. Each working day is divided into two sessions: the forenoon and the afternoon. The forenoon session shall have three periods each of one hour duration and the afternoon session has two periods each of one hour duration.
3. The first bell is given five minutes before the start of the both forenoon and afternoon sessions. At the stroke of the first bell, students shall go to their respective classes and take their seats. After the teacher's entry, prayer shall be recited in the forenoon session.
4. As per university guidelines academic year consists of two semesters of 90 days each. Only those students who have obtained a minimum of 75% of the attendance in a semester are allowed to sit for examination. Those students who have only 60% to 74% of attendance would be permitted to write the examination on the payment of a condonation fees prescribed by the University.
5. Attendance shall be marked at the beginning of every period.
6. Any student who is not present in the class when the roll is called shall be treated as absent and marked accordingly.
7. Students are not permitted to take leave on the days of internal tests and model examinations. Absence for a test will attract a fine of Rs.50/-
8. Any student who has been absent for five days or more without any valid reason shall be subjected to disciplinary action including removal of name from the register after following due procedure prescribed.

8. Absence without applying for leave will entail a fine of Rs.10/- a day.
9. If any student falls sick or has any medical emergency, a medical certificate may be produced.
10. Students who want to apply for leave for the whole day should submit their request for leave in the prescribed leave format to the class teacher at least a day in advance.
11. In case of medical reason or any other emergency then leave application may be submitted the next day.
12. Any student seeking leave for a portion of the day or part of a class may approach the teacher concerned.
13. The leave rules are subject to the regulations followed by the university.

Dress Code

The college management expects the students to dress in all decency and modesty. For reasons connected to culture sensitivities, tight-fitting clothes, transparent dress materials, sleeveless tops, pants and any other article of clothing that appears to be indecent or vulgar or immodest are prohibited on the campus. Any wilful disobedience shall attract disciplinary action by the college administration.

Identity Card

An identity card will be issued to every student. Students are expected to wear the card when they enter the campus and they should produce the card at the office or before any authorities or authorized persons whenever they are asked to. If the identity card is lost or stolen, then the same shall be reported to the office immediately. A new identity card may be issued on payment of Rs.75 from the office.

Library – Rules and Regulations

1. Each and every student shall have an access to the library.
2. The library is kept open from 9.00 AM to 4.30 PM on all working days.
3. The students are expected to maintain silence in the reading room.
4. Library tickets will be issued to all students. Books may be borrowed only on the production of the library ticket and identity card.
5. Reference books and current periodicals will not be allowed to be taken out of the library.
6. Open Access system is followed.
7. The students may browse the net which is available in our library with a speed of 10mbps for educational / academic reference purpose only.
8. Loss of library tickets has to be brought to the notice of the librarian immediately and a new ticket will be issued on request with a fine of Rs. 10/-
9. The borrowed books are to be returned to the library in good condition within the prescribed period.
10. The student is expected to inspect the book carefully for any damage before borrowing it.
11. In the event of student finding a book in damaged or disfigured shape, the same shall be reported to the librarian immediately before borrowing the book. The librarian on seeing such books

may either replace them with new ones or better ones or may stamp on the damaged part with her initial to acknowledge such damage.

12. In the event of loss of books or damage, then the appropriate cost will be recovered.
13. The books borrowed for reference shall be returned within the due date and in the event of delay caused, then, a fine of Rs. 1/- shall be levied per day since the expiry of due date.
14. The library shall remain closed on Sundays and other notified holidays.
15. The students who want to avail e-learning facilities shall be required to make the prescribed fees for access.
16. Mobile phones or any other instruments or gadgets which needlessly attract the attention of the readers and cause disturbance to the environment of library are strictly prohibited.
17. Library offers basic facilities such as photocopying of the materials in limited number as per fair use policy only for educational purpose on payment of minimum charge.
18. The books or other materials which are covered under copyright laws are not to be copied for it amounts to infringements and violations of copyrights of the author.
19. The college has got registered under **NLIST** (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) which grants access unlimited to e-resources.

Payment of fees

1. The students are to pay fees as per the following schedule.
Last date for paying the fees :
 - ❖ Odd semester is 16th July 2018
 - ❖ Even Semester is 31st December 2018
2. If the fees are not paid before due dates, then the students' names will be removed from the record.
3. The students whose names were struck off from the record have to apply for re-admission after paying a re-admission fee of Rs.250/-
4. The student will not be given the credit of attendance during such period.
4. Fees have to be paid only in the college counter between 9.30.A.M and 3.30 P.M. and every payment has to be acknowledged with a receipt with a college stamp.
5. The students are expected to keep all the fees receipts as proof of payment till each semester end.

End Semester Exams

1. There shall be two end semester exams every year.
2. On the payment of all the arrears of the fees the student will be given 'no due' certificate by the office and on the production of such certificates hall tickets will be issued.
3. A detailed report of the students' performance in the semester examination along with the attendance put in by the students will be sent to the parents.
4. In the event of the performance of the students being unsatisfactory the parents shall be asked to meet the principal or HOD or the counsellor for appropriate academic intervention.

Internal Exams

1. Three internal exams for 20 marks each are conducted for every semester, and the average of the best two marks will be taken for consolidation.
2. The students shall be given two assignments, one class assignment and one home assignment each for 5 marks. The average of the assignment marks for 5 will be added to the test marks of 20. The total consolidated internal marks will be $20+5=25$.
3. Apart from this test, there shall be a model examination conducted for every semester before the university examination.

Rules concerning Documents/ Certificates

Bonafide Certificate

This certificate serves as an official record of the student's enrolment in a program of study. The students who are desirous of applying for the same may do so by paying the prescribed fee of Rs. 20/- and the certificate may be issued either the same day or a day after.

Conduct Certificate

This certificate will be issued only upon completion of the course subject to the condition that the candidate's conduct is satisfactory. Students can't apply for this certificate during the course of study. The students may make an application for both Transfer certificate and Conduct certificate immediately upon the completion of the program.

Transfer Certificate

A student who applies for the Transfer certificate should pay the nominal fee of Rs.200/- in the office. A separate application is available at the office for TC and Conduct Certificate. But, before applying for this certificate, the student is required to clear all the dues from the college and a ‘no-due’ certificate obtained from college office duly signed by the officer of the department concerned, library, Head of the Department and office is also mandatory.

Instructions to Student Passengers

The management for reasons connected to safety, security convenience and comfort requires all the students who are admitted in the college to avail of the transport facility provided by the college. The college has a total of 14 buses and vans ferrying students from different places in and around Kayalpatnam. The residents of Kayalpatnam could avail this opportunity from any corner of the town on payment. Our buses ply in various routes covering a radius of around 40kms.

The transport charges are fixed based on the distance between the campus and their respective places of residence. Application forms to avail transport services can be obtained from the office by paying a nominal fee of Rs.10/-. The college administration expects the students to be decent and well-behaved during their travel to the campus. Details of the bus fees can be had from the office.

1. Bus fares have to be paid in advance.
2. Students are expected to be ready at the boarding point at least 5 minutes before the fixed time of the arrival of vehicle.

3. If any student misses the vehicle, then she has to make her own arrangement for transportation to the college.
4. On no account fees once paid for transport shall be refunded.
5. Students are expected to show their Identity Card on demand.
6. Students are expected to behave well inside the bus and their behaviour should not in any way damage the image of the college.
7. Bus fees are subject to change from time to time depending on the factors related to fuel price /Road Taxes etc.
8. College vehicles are run on no-profit and no-loss basis and so the transport fees are determined by the factors like distance and fuel price.

Excursion, Study Tours, Field Trips and Industrial Visits

1. Students are expected to participate in curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular activities.
2. The college may organize excursions, study tours, industrial visits and picnics. The students are required to join them.
3. Students are not permitted to organize excursions, tours or picnics on their own.
4. The itenararies related to excursions, tours, picnics or industrial visits have to be approved by the principal.
5. Students who want to join such programs should obtain permission and consent from the parents in the prescribed form.
6. Students going on tours should take care of their belongings. They are advised not to bring costly jewellery. They may deposit their money with the teacher coordinator.
7. Students wearing jewels do so at their risk. In the event of theft or loss, the management cannot be held liable.

Quality Circle

The College has established Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) with the objective of defining, promoting and sustaining quality through periodical reviews, developmental interventions and evaluation mechanisms. It hopes to create an environment which is conducive to the development of quality education by following standard procedures, recommended by NAAC. Developmental Intervention Programs

With the sole intention of reaching out to the students who are slow-learners and to help in their process of education, Wavoo Wajeeha College for Women introduces several programs under “Developmental Intervention Programs”. They are listed as follows:

Bridge Course

This course is offered at the entry level in order to give an orientation to the **first year students** to facilitate them to understand the complexities of college education and to brief them about the standards of quality expected and participation solicited. This course is conducted for all the groups of the students in first year for a **period of five days**. The course covers basic components which are considered prerequisites for the students to understand and follow classroom lectures with greater degree of confidence and comfort. Though primary focus is on English language development, the course seeks to cover many fundamental aspects of the other subjects such as Tamil/Arabic too. Besides this, our college gives intensive training in different technical streams so that students will be brought to a level of understanding with which they can participate and perform in successive classroom interactions effectively.

Remedial Coaching

Remedial coaching has been introduced in our college to **assist the slow-learners** to help them in whatever way possible to bring the latent talents out and dormant skills explored. This is an intensive training which is offered in different subjects by the departments concerned. The student advisors are expected to identify such students who require special care and attention based on their performances in the college and university examinations and the same shall be reported to the subject teachers. These programs include both tutorials and intensive training. The students are expected to make use of this program in their best interest of education.

Students Counselling Body

Students are subjected to multiple influences and those get reflected in their studies and their participation in other academic activities. We, at Wavoo Wajeeha Women's College believe that every student is unique and capable of contributing her uniqueness to the betterment of the society. But, unfortunately the factors which interfere with the performances range from personal to social. Such factors have to be identified and appropriate measures have to be taken to encourage the students to bring their best out. The student counsellors interact with the students on regular basis through various programs and developmental activities. Such initiatives offer chances to the students to open up and to have heart to heart talk with the counsellors. Apart from counselling, the college arranges classes and training sessions by professional counsellors at regular intervals. This interaction is expected to yield significant results.

Advisory System

The Advisory System maintained in our college helps the teachers have a comprehensive understanding of the students' background. Every class has been allotted to an Advisor who is expected to have all information related to students' personal data, academic profile and information related to students' interests and participation index in several other activities. The Advisor keeps tracking the academic record of the students until they graduate from the college. The advisor plays the role of a friend, in listening to the problems of the students, a philosopher, in offering them knowledge and values, and a guide, in channelizing the efforts and energy of the students towards academic developments. The advisor, at the end of the course, based on her interactions and observation, provides every out-going student of her batch with a General Proficiency Certificate which reflects students' participation in academic activities, creativity, inter-personal relationship, attendance, leadership qualities and other academic initiatives.

Association Meetings

Every department conducts its Association Meeting at regular intervals or as decided by the HOD in consultation with the Principal. In these meetings normally guest lectures are delivered by the experts invited from outside, and in some special cases training classes or workshops may also be arranged. Also, students have to be constantly motivated in such meetings to participate in the continual process of learning. Every department is expected to document such meetings and the same shall be submitted to the Principal periodically. Every Association Meeting features certain academic programs to encourage students' participation. The students who have participated and demonstrated their academic talents impressively shall be honoured with certificates, prizes and in some cases cash awards by the college management.

Alumnae Association

Alumnae Association is formed with an objective of having continual engagement with the graduates of our college in activities connected to **academic and social developments**. Every student who passes out of the college becomes a member of the Association. The office bearers of this Association are elected according to the procedure contemplated. The Association meeting is normally conducted once in a semester unless otherwise required as per the demands of the context. The primary objective of this Association is expected to build a bridge of interaction between the present students of the college and those of the past in order to share the expertise, exposure and experience in expanding the boundaries of understanding in mutually beneficial manner which is expected to offer our present students' perspectives required for success in personal and professional life.

Objectives

1. To offer suggestions/recommendations in academic matters in the best interest of quality education and to offer assistance as required.
2. To involve in various social welfare programs in collaboration with the college through forming a chain of Self-Help Groups.
3. To offer a helping hand to students who are economically backward by providing them with scholarship or any other form of assistance in consultation with the management.

Parent – Teacher Association

This Association facilitates meaningful interaction between the teachers and the parents in the spirit of shared responsibilities. The frequent interactions the Association organizes help the teachers understand the reality of expectations, and also help the parents to understand the role they are expected to play in the context of continual demographic changes. Training Activities

1. Communication Skills

Communication is listed as the most important skill. Interpersonal communication skills are very important for a graduating student to possess. Ability to communicate effectively in a language of choice is of paramount importance. Most employers want their hired graduates to be able to follow instructions, speak clearly, give clear instructions and make effective presentations. Wavoo Wajeeha Women's College designs and develops special programs to address this need to empower the graduating students of ours with required skills in Communication.

2. Mock Interviews

Our college offers the students real-life experience in facing interviews. We arrange periodical mock interview sessions for all our final year students and introduce them to the skills required for such sessions. We try to rope in the experts in the field along with our trained teachers for conducting these sessions effectively on campus.

Before appearing for interview, the students will be given orientations in preparation of resume, cover letter, documentation skills, body language, dress sense and etiquettes in communication. On the days identified for such mock interview sessions, students will have to come prepared for interviews. On arrival, they will be divided into different groups and placed before interview panel. The panel members, who are professional trainers or expert teachers, will observe the responses of the students, their mannerism, confidence level and attitude and will give a detailed report on each of the students after the whole mock interview session is over. This report will help our students realize where they are and will offer them opportunities for further developments. The students will also be given a detailed list of the interviewers' favourite questions and sample responses to each of those questions. Such developmental interventions are expected to increase the confidence, reduce the stress levels and maximize the chances for favourable consideration from employers' perspectives.

Sports Club

Education becomes incomplete without proper training of body and mind. Our college believes that for a comprehensive education we need to encourage various sports and games and the students' involvement in such activities is expected to increase the

academic performance as well. Sports and games bring all the students together under one roof, irrespective of all the barriers and teach them values which are universal. The students are trained to face life as a challenge and to treat success and failure as two sides of the same coin. Every game has a rule and it needs to be played only according to the rules. These values promote tolerance, perseverance, honesty and devotion.

The sports committee is expected to influence the students by offering them various opportunities of participating in sports and games. The college has a full-fledged department for physical education and the sports committee works in tandem with them. The students of our college are divided under several houses in order to promote a healthy competition in sports and games.

Our Students shine in sports and games not only at the college level but at the University level too. Students had participated in the Mini Marathon conducted by various agencies in and around Thoothukudi District, apart from the Mini Marathon conducted by the M.S. University, and won prizes and certificates creditably. Our students also actively participated at the inter collegiate tournaments and win accolades laudably.

Staff Club

The staff club of our college aims to bring the members of our staff under one roof through various activities of sports and games. The members of the staff develop better understanding of one another which helps them in the process of professionalism. The increased interaction through alternative engagements of this kind does have an impact on the physical, psychological and social well-being of individuals. This club organizes regular staff activities to open up floor for discussion on several matters which concern the field of education also.

The general objectives of the club are as follows:

1. It aims at inculcating the spirit of oneness among the members of the staff.

2. It encourages the staff to participate in physical activities such as sports and games for the healthy campus life.
3. It finds ways and means to help the staff to deal with stress, anxiety, loneliness or any such feeling which is detrimental to the healthy campus life.
4. It also organizes lecture sessions or training sessions on promoting efficiency in professionalism.

Students' Council

Students' Council is an important organ of the administration which reflects on the issues from students' perspectives. Wavoo Wajeeha Women's College is of the firm belief that students have to be given training in leadership qualities, and they should be exposed to the challenges of administration. This activity is expected to promote greater degree of interactions among the students in the interest of education. Democratic values such as tolerance, diversity, civic sense, respect for others, belief in co-existence and regard for consultative process are promoted through engagements in students' council activities. In short, it is an attempt to prepare students to participate in the democratic process with a greater sense of responsibility and devotion, and this process strengthens our democracy in the long run.

The objectives of the Council as are follows:

1. The elected members are expected to work in the best interest of students without causing any damage to the purpose of education or hindrance to the process of education.
2. The elected members' term shall last for only one year and there shall be election to the post every year.

3. The Council shall take up only the issues or problems connected to the well-being of the students and particularly in the interest of education.
4. The Council shall keep the college administration informed about all such meetings and decisions taken in writing.

Editorial Club

Editorial Club of our college is formed with an objective of introducing our students to the responsibilities and challenges involved in editorial tasks, and thereby promoting editorial skills and desk work required for preparation of college magazines and newsletters. The members of the club collect information related to the student developmental activities conducted in different departments, the students' achievements in various events conducted at intra and inter collegiate levels and student events organized periodically or any other such events organized within the campus. The information obtained will be analyzed, organized and structured in order to publish in the College Magazine which is released once a year or in Newsletters which are released twice a semester.

Press Club

This club is formed with the objective of having better interaction with the media and public. The college normally conducts several activities and programs. These programs and activities are to be documented by Press Club on time and the same shall be sent to the media after obtaining due consent from the college administration. Press Club forms a bridge between the media and the college and it has a significant role to play in creating a positive image on the minds of the public through dissemination of information.

Entrepreneurial Development Cell

We have established Entrepreneurial Development Cell in our college to encourage our students to have constructive experiments with their ideas through the individual initiatives, and through organizing social or economic mechanism to turn resources and situations into practical account and also to encourage them to take calculated risk while they are advancing in the direction of their dreams. We organize regular seminars/ workshops/ training sessions to develop entrepreneurship skills of women in order to empower them with the skills and inputs required so that they will continue their march towards excellence independently.

Entrepreneurial Development Cell has been formed in our college in order to meet their following objectives. They are:

1. To initiate our students into the world of Entrepreneurship by introducing them to new business ideas, changing economic contexts and novel business plans.
2. To seek economic independence of women through bringing out entrepreneurial skills via meaningful education.
3. To have collaboration and partnership with different government and non-government agencies to promote entrepreneurial skills amongst the students
4. To arrange vocational training in jewellery making, arts & craft works, tailoring and other related areas in order to ensure the process of self employment and economic liberation.

Partnership Programs with ICT – Information & Communication Technology

Wavoo Wajeeha Women's College has been an associative member of ICTACT, Tamil Nadu since the academic year 2011-2012. Thanks to the educational initiatives of the ICT Academy, our members of staff are frequently getting trained in technical skills and such training shall be, in turn, imparted to our students. For the past three years intensive training programs have been arranged for our staff members in the areas such as Web development by using .NET technologies, Cloud computing, Grid computing and other related technical training from industry perspectives. These trained staff members impart such technical skills to the students of Computer Science and Information Technology. Through this educative engagement the students of our college are exposed to both theoretical and practical knowledge, and **ICT has given course certificates to the students trained** in the process and such students enjoy better chances of being considered favorably by the industries.

Research and Development Cell

Research and Development Cell has been started in our college in order to encourage the research activities in the wider interests of the society. The college extends financial assistance for research publications and constantly motivates the staff to explore and extend the horizons of their chosen field with academic spirit and responsibility. We conduct regular interaction programs with the experts in the areas related to Research Writing, Research Methodology, Ethics in Research, Data interpretation, and Documentation formalities. The objectives of R&D Cell are as follows:

1. To facilitate the research process by orienting both the students and staff into the intricacies of research.

2. To offer financial assistance for substantial research publication in referred /peer-reviewed journals with ISSN numbers.
3. To enlighten the students and staff on the matters connected to various research opportunities/ UGC projects/ Government and non-government projects .
4. To offer academic help to the research scholars in submitting a research proposal / analyzing a proposal/ interpreting research finding and documenting research activities.
5. To assist the teachers and students in their academic research and consultancy work as per the demands of the contexts.

Women Development Cell

Women Development Cell has been established in our college with a view to promoting the skills, competencies and talents of women towards their economic independence. It organizes periodical training programs in creating awareness about women's rights and responsibilities. The programs organized by this Cell attempt socialization of progressive activities and attitudes for stimulating women's growth and such activities have yielded good results in social levels. It also focuses on increased women participation in social developmental activities. Anti-Ragging Committee

The college is committed to ensure a peaceful campus wherein there is respect for fellow students, regard for teachers, and adherence to rules and compliance with code of conduct. Students have been advised through various interventionists programs to refrain themselves from activities which may amount to ragging. The college has formed a committee exclusively for the purpose of preventing instances of ragging and educating the students about the nature and consequences of the act called ragging. The college, in compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its order dated 16.05.2007, has been implementing the rules and regulations for prevention of Ragging.

1. Ragging is broadly defined as any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student. It also includes exploiting the services of a junior student for completing the academic task assigned to an individual or a group of seniors. It has several aspects such as psychological, social, political, economic, cultural and academic dimensions.
2. Ragging also includes teasing others for fun or poking at others by using words of abuse or insults which may damage an individual's sense of self-worth.
3. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student by senior students may also be called an aspect of ragging.
4. Any act of physical abuse including acts related to sexual abuse, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person can also be called ragging.

5. Any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, blogs, public insults should also be considered ragging.
6. From human rights perspective, any attempt made to cause damage to life, dignity, self-respect or any other act which threatens the life and dignity of the individuals may also be called an act of ragging.

Disciplinary Action Committee

This committee is formed with the sole purpose of maintaining discipline and order on the campus. The college campus is administered in a systematic manner to ensure efficient learning in an atmosphere of peace, safety and security. Any attempt to violate the atmosphere of peace shall be viewed very seriously. The reports of violations of college discipline rules, willful disobedience, attempts made to cause damage to life or property and any other acts which vitiate the peaceful academic environment of the college shall be reported to the Disciplinary Action Committee. The committee shall take appropriate decision based on the nature and gravity of such acts and suggests ways and means to stop the recurrence of such acts.

When a student violates the rules of the college, based on the severity of the act, the student shall be summoned by the committee and asked to offer explanation in writing, and even after submission of such an explanation, if the student does not show any sign of regret or still continues the willful act of violation, then the same matter shall be reported to the parents. Even after all these attempts, if the same student continues to act in open violation, then the matter shall be viewed very seriously and on the advice of duly appointed committee that student may be removed from the roll of the college.

Grievance Redressal Cell

This has been established to give a voice to the students and teachers to express their concerns and grievances. The college is dedicated to create a peaceful environment on the campus for all the stakeholders to learn and to enjoy the process of learning. The grievance cell objectively looks into the complaints received from the teachers and students and addresses them properly by following the procedure stipulated.

Value Education Cell

We, in Wavoo Wajeeha Women's College, believe that the meaning of human life is ascertained in terms of the purpose which influences it. Life, in philosophical term 'is an opportunity' granted from The Almighty, and what an individual is going to do with it is 'the purpose' which brings meaning and value to her. In order to realize the purpose of life, and to reach the destiny, an individual needs to be aware of the stages and steps which enable her to reach what she is destined to reach. For this great purpose, Education plays an important role. Education is not mere reading of books or learning of facts and figures. It is a value-oriented education which begins with a quest of exploration of meaning of life and ends in the delight of self-realization.

In order to realize such an ideal vision of education we provide in our college a kind of education which results in integrated understanding of life. It facilitates our students to become morally strong, culturally aware and socially responsible.

Deeniyath Classes

These classes are intended to help the Muslim students in understanding the core values of Islam. This understanding is expected to expand the horizon of understanding of the world that we live in, and to influence the students to imbibe the best values of Humanity that Islam promotes such as respect for others, promoting peace and tolerance, service to the cause of poor, moral regulations. God consciousness and spiritual peace and contentment. These classes are conducted by our qualified teachers who have got relevant experience and exposure to Islamic studies. All the Muslim students are expected to make the best possible advantages of these classes towards reaching their ultimate goal of education.

Readers' Forum

Readers' Forum of our college is established with a view to promoting reading skills among our students. This forum gives a chance to the students to appear on stage to have an experience of reading something which they believe worth sharing and that experience is destined to give confidence, courage and competency.

The objectives of the forum shall be as follows:

1. To encourage students to read beyond the prescribed text books.
2. To engage the students through discussions on different topics in order to provide them with a world view.
3. To encourage the students to open up to discussion in any formal situation and to participate with required courage and confidence.

Writers' Forum

Wavoo Wajeeha Women's College has established Writers' Forum in order to bring to light the talents of the budding writers and introduce them to the world of writing. It invites creative works represented in the form of writing, paintings, arts, or any other projections of literary or critical value. The forum proposes to publish a manuscript and for which it invites essays, short stories,

anecdotes, puzzles, funny incidents, jokes, useful tips and any other similar items of interest. Such collected contributions will be screened by the forum members and based on the quality they will be recommended for inclusion in the Manuscript Magazine run by the forum. Also the forum conducts periodically writing competitions in both Tamil and English languages.

The objectives of the form are as follows:

1. To encourage students to develop the skills in writing essays, poems, articles and other activities such as painting, arts and cartoons.
2. To publish a manuscript magazine from the forum once in a semester.
3. To conduct essay writing or verse writing competitions in both English and Tamil.
4. To impart training in the art of writing through workshops/ training sessions and this may be conducted once in a semester.
5. To invite writers of different fields during frequent intervals to have an intellectual engagement with the students.

Youth Welfare Forum

This forum has been started in our college to encourage creativity and innovations of our students which normally get reflected in students' participation in varied activities. The college is dedicated to engage the students in novel ways in order to cultivate in them a wide variety of skills which include cultural, social, technical and educational and to present them to the public as expressions of excellence. The college organizes once in a year a grand culture festival called '**Lolly Fiesta**' which show cases the best talents

representing different fields and facets. For II Year Students

Hand work : The students are taught how to make decorative pillows, covers for seats and sofas, pen-stands, flower-vase etc.,

Artifical Jewellery Making : To train students to make artificial jewellery from ordinary materials that are cheap, elegant and safe to wear.

Tailoring : With enough sewing machines available in the college, the students get a chance to master the art of tailoring.

Tally : Computerized accounting procedures are taught to the students.

For III Year Students

TNPSC Competitive Examination Coaching : The basics of General Knowledge, Reasoning, Mathematics, Sciences, Social studies and Tamil are taught to students who plan to appear for Competitive exams.
