Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) Report – 2022-2023

Our institution's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been working relentlessly to ensure and enhance education quality and overall academic excellence. IQAC has undertaken several initiatives to improve education quality in 2022-2023. During the year, IQAC conducted nearly 16 meetings with criteria heads, NAAC coordinators, and the principal Madam to discuss various aspects of quality assurance. The meetings were held to ensure that each department maintained the necessary files and documents to support the quality assurance process.

The meetings were instrumental in identifying areas of improvement, discussing solutions, and implementing changes to enhance education quality. The discussions focused on curriculum development, student feedback mechanisms, infrastructure facilities, research and extension activities, and overall academic excellence.

On 16.06.2022, an IQAC meeting was held with management members, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Criterion heads, the NAAC coordinator, and Principal in attendance. The meeting discussed the drawbacks and missing information in each criterion. The Criteria information was also to be presented in Powerpoint Presentation.

During the meeting, the criteria heads presented their criteria information, highlighting strengths and weaknesses. The NAAC coordinator provided insights into NAAC accreditation requirements, and management members and Principal shared their perspectives on the presentation.

Several points were raised during the meeting, including the need for more data and evidence to support the claims made in the presentation. Additionally, criteria must align with the institution's goals and objectives.

On August 4th, 2022, a meeting was held in the IQAC room at 12.00 am for the IQAC coordinator, Assistant IQAC coordinator, and all criteria heads. The meeting was to discuss several significant matters related to the university, including placement details and the one-rupee scheme was discussed. The IQAC Coordinator emphasized the importance of providing the most suitable placement opportunities for students. He directed all heads to

ensure a smooth and efficient process. The IQAC Coordinator presented the details of the "One Rupee Scheme" which is an initiative to provide financial assistance to students from economically weaker sections. The scheme was well received by all members, and it was decided to implement it in the current academic year.

On September 9th, 2022, an IQAC meeting was held in the IQAC room with the IQAC Co-ordinator, Assist Co-ordinator, and all Criteria heads to discuss NAAC accreditation. The NAAC members discussed the current status of the accreditation process and decided to work continuously for the next 45 days to complete the required work.

During the meeting, the IQAC coordinator presented a detailed work plan. This included a timeline for completing various tasks accreditation task. The plan included activities such as data collection, analysis, and documentation. It also included drafting the self-study report and preparing for the peer team visit.

An IQAC meeting was held in the IQAC room on 12.09.2022 at 10.00 am. The meeting was attended by the IQAC coordinator, Assistant coordinator, Ist Criteria Head, IIIrd Criteria Head, and VIIth Criteria Head. The meeting was to discuss various aspects of college website updating. In addition, the meeting discussed project report details, feedback forms from students regarding the curriculum, and the green audit report.

On 22.09.2022, a meeting of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was held in the institution's principal's room. The meeting was attended by the NAAC Coordinator, Assistant Coordinator, and heads of the 4th, 5th, and 6th criteria. The main agenda of the meeting was to discuss the internal audit report of the 4th, 5th, and 6th criteria. During the meeting, the IQAC members examined the internal audit report findings and identified areas for improvement. The members also discussed ways to address the issues identified in the report. They also discussed ways to ensure the institution meets the NAAC criteria.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) met in the principal's room on 23.09.2022 at 10:00 AM. The meeting was attended by the IQAC coordinator, Assistant coordinator, Ist Criteria Head, 2nd Criteria Head, 5th Criteria Head, and 7th Criteria Head. Meeting objectives included strengthening criteria parameters for scoring more marks.

During the meeting, the attendees discussed the current criteria parameters and identified areas for improvement. They also shared their ideas on how to strengthen the

criteria parameters to score more marks. The attendees agreed to work together to develop a plan to improve the criteria parameters.

On 1st October 2022, an IQAC meeting was held in the ICT Hall at 10.30 am. The meeting was attended by the principal, the IQAC coordinator, and the Asst. IQAC Coordinator, 1st Criteria Head, and committee members.

During the meeting, committee members discussed the 1st Criteria presentation. The presentation was reviewed, and members were asked to collect feedback from alumni. They are asked to include the YouTube link and PPT presentation in the coursework notes.

The meeting also discussed the introduction of add-on courses and extra credit courses for students. The committee members discussed the benefits of these courses, such as providing students with an opportunity to gain additional knowledge and skills beyond their regular coursework. It was decided that these courses would be offered to students in the upcoming academic year. The committee members were asked to develop a course curriculum for these courses.

The IQAC meeting was held on 1st November 2022 in the principal's room. The participants discussed various issues related to the workload, timetable, and bending work of the criteria. The following decisions were taken during the meeting: The participants discussed the bending work of the criteria and agreed that it needs to be completed as soon as possible. They decided to allocate specific tasks to each member of the criteria and set deadlines for completion.

On 10.11.2022 at 11.45 am, the IQAC met in the principal's room. Principal Madam, IQAC coordinator, assistant IQAC coordinator, and all criteria heads attended. In addition to the internal audit report of criteria, the department vision and mission, the logo, add-on courses, and the academic calendar were discussed at the meeting.

On Jan 11th, 2023, an IQAC meeting was held in the ICT hall at 2.50 pm. The meeting was attended by several esteemed individuals and Dr. Mrs. V. Rama, the institution's principal. Dr. A. Syed Mohamed, the IQAC coordinator at Sadakathullah Appa College. Mrs. S.A. Rahmath Ameena Begum, IQAC coordinator, and Dr. Mrs. J. Sugantham Parimala, Assistant IQAC coordinator. All criteria heads from each department would also be present.

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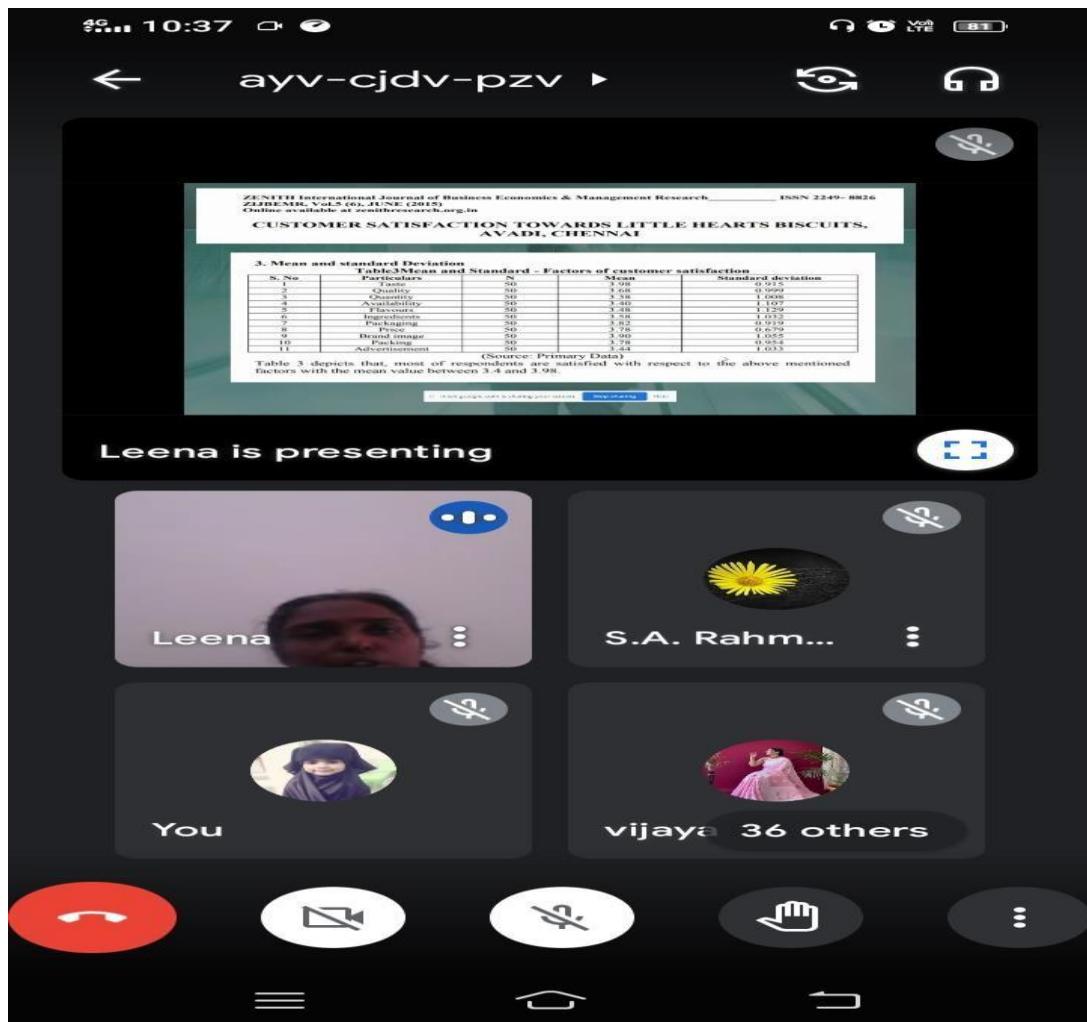

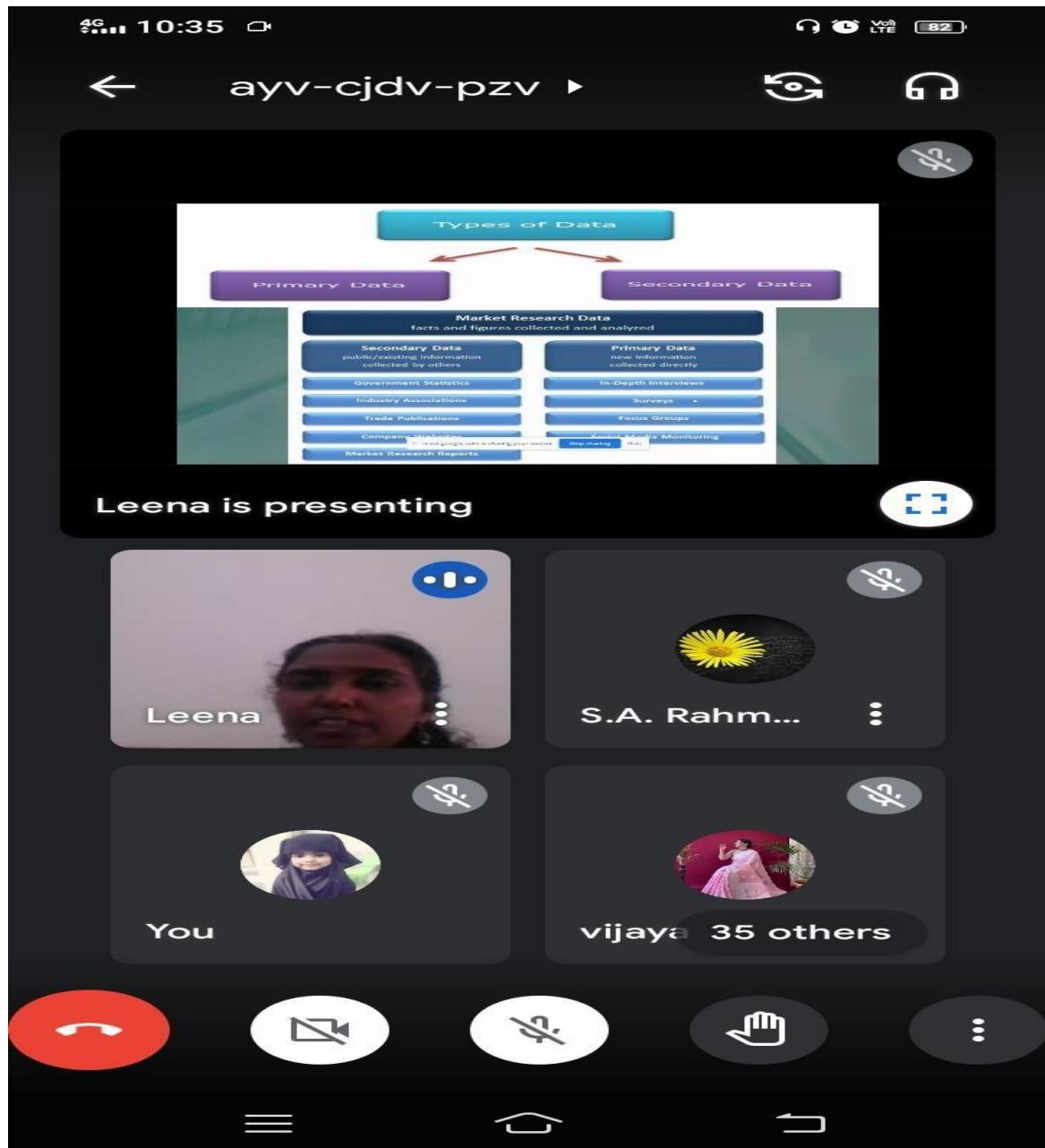
Faculty Development Program (FDP) on Outcome-Based Education (OBE).
